competing from 6 different high schools in the greater Auckland area on Saturday May the 14th at the New Zealand Academy of Fencing located at the old Otahuhu rec centre , 7- Piki-Thompson way in Otahuhu. Overall rankings for the secondary school fencing championships have awarded **Jeffery** a bronze medal for his performance in Sabre.
