Match one- against Auckland Grammar.
(Loss 2-6)

On Friday 13th February MRGS played Auckland Grammar School at Epsom Girls Pool. A very slow start to the match by MRGS' defence saw Grammar capitalise by going two goals to Roskill's one at the end of the first quarter. Several saves made by goalie Daniel Verhoeven helped the Roskill score line and a second goal scored by Ryan Goodin gave Roskill a finishing score of two goals in reply to Auckland Grammar's six! Roskill lacked the intensity on defence and not enough shots fired on goal.



Match two- against St Peters. (WIN 6-4)

On Sunday 15th February MRGS played St Peter's at Epsom Girls Grammar School. MRGS came out firing in the first quarter, Ryan Goodin in hole gaining a kick out to give MRGS a six on five, which was converted by Jordan Harris.
