One of them - the low-cost intraocular lens, which he invented in his garage - costs only \$6 and has saved the sight of millions of the poorest people in the world. We were reminded of our school vision of **quality learning that results in active and responsible citizenship.**

Last Friday a large gathering of staff, students and Members of the BoT acknowledged the **outstanding service of Mrs Raewyn Winny** to our community. Mrs Winny has taken medical retirement. She has been a great leader in our school and widely respected because of her deeds and actions in



mentoring so many students and teachers. She has been instrumental in establishing the school's excellent professional learning programme. The boys' choir, the jazz band and the kapa haka all gave wonderful tributes to Mrs Winny.

BLAKE MEDALLIST AND 2010 NEW ZEALANDER OF THE YEAR RAY AVERY

On Monday the 28th of June, we were lucky to be visited by Mr Ray Avery, a pharmaceutical scientist and social entrepreneur. Mr Avery has this year been awarded the Blake Medal by the Sir Peter Blake Trust and John Key has announced him as the first ever New Zealander of the Year. His work will potentially benefit 30 million people suffering from cataract blindness around the world.

At an assembly presentation, Mr Avery spoke about his work and the characteristics he believes makes a great leader saying that "one of the derivatives of good leadership is having good moral values. " He wants to promote the goodness of the human condition and encouraged everyone present to look after their friends, their country and their planet. He is proud to be a New Zealander, and says that we are a country of leaders.



We were honoured to have Mr Avery speaking at our school assembly. We learnt much about helping others and being good leaders. In the words of Mr. Avery himself, "You can achieve a lot more with an attitude where you are open to working with people. Nobody is as clever as all of us together."
