


assistance and advice to make the evening a success.

2015 has been another successful season for Orienteering. The team competes in the Central Zone of the Auckland Schools Sprint Series. This involves completing courses at schools around Auckland on a weekly basis and the scores being accumulated for an overall score for the series. After 5 events this year we had 7 students qualifying for the sprint finals which took place on 28th March. The final was run over a morning course at Akoranga Campus (AUT) and Carrington Unitec in the afternoon. Our top runners were Janita Fuller (7th Senior Girls) and Felix Yang (5th Intermediate Boys)



which are great results as Felix has moved into the next age group this season and Janita is competing against girls who are in the National Squad running for New Zealand. Both Janita and Felix are talented orienteers and have been invited to be considered as members of the interim Squad for the Auckland Regional team. Our other finalists did well all of them finishing in the top 25. Four of them are Year 9 students and I look forward to them developing in the sport over their time at Mount Roskill.

We also took 3 junior teams to the Sprint Relays at Totara Park on the 30th April. This is a very popular



event and there are some very serious competitors from orienteering teams as well as school teams. Although unplaced all our students enjoyed the challenge of a longer course that was run in more open countryside than that offered in the school grounds. They also had to deal with the challenge of some severe rain and unleashed dogs but all agreed it was a good experience.

Thanks as always to the staff and parents who support us and transport students to and from events. Without this all of our students keen to compete would not get the opportunity.

If you have not received a login and password please contact the school office.

You will need to have pdf reader software on your computer or device. You can get a free download from this address: http://get.adobe.com/reader

Parent Portal App for Mobile Devices

To install the App on your device you need to search for "Kamar" in the Android Playstore or the Apple App store. From this app you can check credits attained and student attendance.

Steps:

- 1. Download the Application
- 2. Install
- 3. Open and click on Settings
- 4. Enter the server address: http://kamar.mrgs.school.nz
- 5. **Username** is your normal Kamar username
- 6. Password is your normal Kamar password
- 7. It is possible to save the user name and password in the settings area. Beware that if your device is accessed by other people that this is a security risk.



SUPPORTING STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

LATENESS TO SCHOOL

One aspect of measuring student engagement is looking at our attendance data. Our target for this year is to achieve an overall 90% attendance rate. We are currently on track to reach this overall target for the year.

From the data of 2014 one issue the data identified was students being late for school. Lateness to class impacts on the learning of the student who is late and also disrupts the learning of others in the class. We



recently sent a letter, via email, informing families about our lateness strategy which we have implemented from the 18 May. We have an expectation that all students will be no more than 4 mins to class. Should students be late they will be expected to make the time up that was lost from their learning at a lunch time or after school. If your child is late an email message will also be sent to you.

Being late to class - Facts:

5 mins LATE each day of school year = 3 days of learning time LOST 15 mins LATE each day of school year = 10 days of learning time LOST 30 mins LATE each day of school year = 19 days of learning time LOST

RIGHT TIME RIGHT PLACE: make learning count at ROSKILL!

We appreciate all the support families have so far given to our school and have already noticed significant improvement.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES ABOUT ATTENDANCE

In order for students to be successful, powerful learners they need to be in class on time in every lesson.

If a student misses two periods (this can include roll check and LCT) they are recorded as having missed half a day of lessons and this is reported to the Ministry of Education.

Teachers mark their roll on the computer every period. This allows us to monitor attendance statistics for both individual and groups of student more frequently and closely. If you have any concerns about attendance or want to report an absence, please phone Mrs Hyland, Attendance Officer, on 621 0069 or email attendance@mrgs.school.nz Please phone on the morning of your child's first day of absence. When we do not receive a call from the family a text message is sent out. Students are expected to be in every class on time in order to be successful powerful learners. Parents/caregivers have been sent their password to access the parent portal in order to view attendance.

We look forward to working with you to support your son/daughter in being engaged in their learning.

The Ministry of Education now has a NEW code for the way the school is required to record absence. Families who take holidays during the school term will have their son/daughter's absence recorded as an unjustified absence.



CORNER OF CHINESE CULTURE

A group of professionals from the Chinese New Settlers Service Trust were invited by Liu Lao Shi from Languages MRGS. They have given demonstrations in Chinese Calligraphy, Paper Cutting and Kung Fu. Students were provided with the authentic Chinese brush and ink to create their unique writing in Chinese. They have



learned how to appreciate the art of Chinese Character Writing. In the Hall, a group of students had a fantastic experience in practicing Kung Fu with a Kung Fu champion from China. A lot of others students enjoyed watching the fist and sword dance.

JUNIOR CURRICULUM UPDATE

As you will be aware we have been implementing Phase one of our junior curriculum at Year 9 this year with the new academies, the Samoan language, Performing Arts, Core Technology, Financial Education and Chinese. In the next few weeks we will be asking students for feedback on their learning. One of our aims has been to provide students with the opportunity for greater choice in their learning.

SUCCESS IN AUCKLAND MATHEMATICAL OLYMPIAD

BODYSAFE COLLABORATION PROJECT NEWS.

We are now in our second year of running the BodySafe Collaboration project, piloting a Ministry of Justice funded whole-school approach to sexual safety.

Thank you to all the parents and caregivers who responded to the BodySafe survey last year.

Many families fed back that they see a need for increased education on issues of consent.

This year all Year 10 students will take part in the "BodySafe" programme, consisting of four sessions with Rape Prevention Education educators, who have now been coming into our school for over a decade.

New this year will be a "Consent Awareness week".

Health teachers will discuss the key issues around consent with all students. Also, students of the Peer Sexuality Support programme (run by the Auckland District Health Board) will run an Assembly item to explain the myths and fact around consent in the context of the New Zealand Law. Rape Prevention Education will run an optional workshop for our Advanced Mediators

This may be a good opportunity for you to discuss respectful healthy relationships with your child.

SORE THROATS MATTER

A sore throat could mean your child has a Group A Streptococcus throat infection.

HEALTH CENTRE MESSAGES/ADVICE

<u>Prevent the spread of Flu</u> and the common cold by frequent hand washing and covering your mouth when you cough.

Signs of the Flu: (sudden onset), Moderate to severe illness lasting 7 – 10 days, Fever (usually high), shivering, muscle aches, headache (may be severe), dry cough may become moist, Can suffer severe complications (pneumonia), bed rest if necessary.

Signs of a cold: (Mild illness), Mild Fever, a runny nose, muscle pain (uncommon), mild headache (congested sinuses), sometimes a cough.

Skin Infections- Boils

A boil is a red lump or pimple with red skin around it. It may have white or yellow pus in the centre and can be painful. If the boil is near the eye go to the doctor straight away.

If the boil bursts, wipe away pus, fluid or blood with clean cotton wool or a clean cloth soaked in water and antiseptic. Cover with a plaster.

Always wash clothing and towels each time after wearing or use. Do not share. If you are given anti biotics by your doctor TAKE ALL THE TABLETS!

See the school nurse or school doctor if you think you have a boil.

PARENTAL VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION
