SENIOR UNIFORM FOR 2010

You will be aware that the school introduced a new junior uniform this year. A new senior uniform will be introduced in 2010. While the new skirts, shorts and trousers for senior students are the same as for the juniors, Year 12 and 13 students will wear a different shirt or blouse and jersey. The uniform is available from the **MRGS Uniform Shop in Somerset Road** next to the hockey turf. The following information will explain how your son or daughter will be affected.

Year 13 students may remain in the current uniform. If you need to purchase a new red jersey you are advised to purchase it from the MRGS Uniform Shop, as the current Year 13 jersey will no longer have any resale value after 2010. If you need to replace other uniform items please purchase them from the MRGS Uniform Shop in Somerset Road.

Year 12 students are scheduled to be in the new senior uniform in 2010. In cases of financial hardship, students may apply for dispensation from the Principal to continue to wear their year 11 uniforms. However, Year 12 students must be either totally in the new senior uniform or in the current Year 11 uniform. There can be no mixing of new and current uniforms and Year 12 boys will not be permitted to wear the current pale blue shirt in 2010.

The official Mount Roskill Grammar School uniform designed and manufactured by Elizabeth Michael is only available from the Mount Roskill Grammar Uniform Shop in Somerset Road.

ROAD SAFETY

Mount Roskill Grammar School is participating in the Auckland City Council's 'Chaos at the School Gate' programme. It involves placing parking officers on patrol outside schools to observe non-compliant behaviours and issue tickets to those illegally parked.

The 'Chaos at the School Gate' programme has been very successful and is helping to reduce the danger to children as well as improve traffic flow around schools.



PASTORAL CARE

Over the past two years we have been reviewing our Pastoral Care structure and in 2010 we will be introducing the revised system. The number of houses will be reduced from eight to five, each one led by a Dean and an Associate Dean. Staff have now been appointed to these positions and part of E block has been renovated to create the "Pastoral Care Centre". By creating the space from which the deans can be based students wellbeing can be better supported as the Deans will be more available and centrally located. Students will notice little change in their form class as the groups remain largely intact and will be led by the same form teacher. The same opportunities will be available for student leadership and we will continue to promote fundraising activities for the local community.

BUILDING

House Deans Offices

The conversion of the north end of E Block into a Pastoral Care Centre housing the Deans and Associate Deans of the reorganised houses has been completed. The space allows for reception, waiting, meeting and interviews as well as work spaces for the leaders.

C Block

The Board of Trustees has let the tender for the rebuilding of C Block to Econobuilt Ltd. While this project started off as a refurbishment of existing rooms we quickly adopted the idea of placing a suite of classrooms on the top of the existing structure. Discussions have lead to further refinement. The existing building will be replaced by a two storey block of thirteen classrooms housing Social Sciences and Media Studies.

Detail planning is underway and demolition is due to happen in January 2010. The whole process should be completed by August 2010.

Please consider using the school Stationery shop when purchasing your students stationery, you will find that we have competitive pricing with the commercial shops (e.g. a 2B5 exercise book sells in shops for \$6.99 we sold them for \$2.50 until we ran out of stock, we still undersell the shops at \$4.50).

Our stationery prices are held at the cost of what we have purchased at the start of the year, we do not raise our prices until that stock has run out and in most years our stock does not run out until the end of the second term.

When our shop is supported by our parents all proceeds from this shop is chanelled back into our school and therefore benefit all our students at MRGS. We look forward to being of service to you at the start of 2010 and for the following terms.
