


# **MENTORING**



This article continues the news about our **Corner of Chinese Culture**. The aim of this group is to provide students with an Experience in Chinese Culture, including Chinese Movie Discovery, Chinese Calligraphy and Paper Cutting, Chinese Kongfu, Chinese Tea Art, Chinese Dance and etc. The aim is that these activities can help students gain an initial and/or insightful experience of Chinese culture.

CCC is well supported by professionals and teachers from Auckland and our local schools. On 8<sup>th</sup> of May, professional Calligraphy and Kongfu Performers who came from the Chinese New Settlers Service Trust offered CCC learners opportunities in learning Chinese Calligraphy, paper cutting and Kongfu training. CCC also has invited our teachers with expertise in performing arts, music and vocal training to be judges during the Competition of 'Corner of Chinese Culture Has Got Talent'.

CCC activities are fun. From 8<sup>th</sup> of May, Corner of Chinese Culture has been organising a great variety of activities weekly to engage our young learners who participated voluntarily. Students have taken great interests in Taichi, Chinese Tea Tasting, Chopstick Use, paper flower pattern cutting, and other cultural-related activities. They were highly engaged because there are competitions, games, and prize draws.

CCC also runs a series of activities relating to Cultural Festivals based on the Lunar Calendar. # 'SPIRIT OF ADVENTURE' - A STUDENT'S TRIP OF A LIFETIME

Year 12 student Joshua Simmons recounts his experience of a Sprit of Adventure voyage.

"During the term 1 school holidays and a week of term 2, I was fortunate to take part in a 10 day youth development voyage 'The Spirit of Adventure'.

The Spirit of Adventure trust allows 40 kids from across New Zealand (i.e. trainees) from age 15 to 19 to spend up to 10 days on a sailing boat; to build confidence, resilience, the ability to break out of our comfort zones, to go to places you wouldn't in your regular life, and learn how to sail the ship with others.

I was dropped off early at Auckland Harbour and I boarded the Spirit, knowing that I wouldn't see my



family for 10 days. At first the idea was daunting since I hadn't been away from home for any longer than 4 days, but also exciting, knowing I was going on this trip not just to holiday, but to develop as a person. I knew nobody on the ship, so I made the effort to meet some of the people onboard, and to think that the 40 of us plus crew were going to be living together for the following 10 days.

The first few days were focused on getting to know each other. They allowed me to make some really good friends from across New Zealand and it was then that I knew I was going to have a lot of fun. We were split into 4 groups of 10, each group was assigned a section of the ship, where we would learn about the sails on that part of the ship, the ropes and what does what.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day, we were able to sail over to Great Barrier Island, a place with the most amazing scenery. We had a few days there, with a day tramp, a swim in the natural hot pools at the end, then a barbeque and bonfire on the beach. The day was definitely one of the highlights of the trip.

Every morning we rose at 6:30am then warmed up and jumped into the water for our morning swim. The first morning was quite cold, but eventually I got used to it. The accommodation consisted of two cabins which each had 21 people, and we ate in a cabin towards the back of the boat during each meal. Each day a group would be serving each meal for the day, and the food was pretty good. Every morning, our groups cleaned our section of the boat so that everything was clean for the day.

I feel like I have so much more to say about what I did, and I could go on for a while. This trip gave me the opportunity to take the time to grow as a person, as I was able to put myself out there and do things with people whom I hadn't met before. I was able to gain a lot more confidence, and it gave me the chance to refocus for school and wider life. This is an opportunity that I would like to thank Mrs Bennett HOD P.E. for giving me, and this could be something that others might be interested in.

I think it's fair to say that this voyage was one of those life experiences that I simply won't forget, and with all the friends I made, it was amazing. I had the time of my life, and maybe in the coming years that could be you."
