

On Monday 14 March the teachers, therapists and other staff from Mt Roskill Primary, Mt Roskill Intermediate and Mt Roskill Grammar will be meeting to review the exciting links and innovations we are developing on our Campus.

The three Campus schools have been working closely together for three years now and the development which has taken place is having a huge and positive impact on the learning of our students.

We are all learning together and this meeting on Monday 14 is an opportunity to review the successes we have had and to confirm our direction for the next three years.

The three schools will close at 2.30 on this day. Any child who cannot be picked up is able to wait at school and will be supervised in the normal manner.

MRGS GAINS TWO PREMIER SCHOLARSHIPS

Mt Roskill Grammar School is very proud of two of its students who are among the nine winners of Premier Scholar Awards nationwide.

Students from the school gained 57 scholarships in a wide range of subjects of which 12 were at the outstanding level.

In 2010, 9,670 students participated in NZ Scholarship exams, with 2,264 students receiving a total of more than \$3.4 million over the next three years. Only nine of these students will receive a Premier Award worth \$30,000 to be paid over three years. These students will take part in the Top Scholar Awards ceremony in Wellington in April/May.

Jordan Zi, MRGS Dux in 2010, gained four scholarships, all at outstanding level. This was the pinnacle of a year of superb academic achievement in which he gained 116 Excellence credits in NCEA Level 3, was awarded a University of Auckland Jubilee Award as well as topping the school in French, Classical Studies, History and Geography and winning the Lacy Cup for Senior Literature.

William Quach was Proxime Accessit (runner –up to Dux) at Mt Roskill Grammar in 2010. He gained seven (7) scholarships in the examinations at the end of the year, three of those at the outstanding level. He was awarded scholarship in Accounting, Geography, Mathematics with Calculus, and Physics and outstanding scholarship in chemistry, Statistics and Modelling and Technology. William earned 96 credits at Excellence Level in NCEA Level 3.



External Examinations


Our pass rates in the external examinations were outstanding and at all three levels of NCEA and well exceeded national levels in 2010.





Pass Rates (External A.S.)


Excellence and Merit Endorsements in 2010 NCEA


The high quality of academic achievement at MRGS dominates the statistics. An impressive 19% of all Year 11 students gaining Level 1, received an "Excellence Endorsement" for achieving more than 50 credits at excellence level. At level 2, 9% and at Level 3, 10% of students gaining an NCEA certificate received excellence endorsements. These figures are well ahead of national averages and the highest the school has ever achieved. In addition, merit endorsements were gained at rates well above the national levels.















Numeracy and Literacy

PEER SUPPORT 2011

They trudged through warily, eyes cast to the shiny, squeaky soles of school-regulation new shoes – glancing fleetingly at anything but me. The bell tolled, reminding me once again that this was the first session of Peer Support –nerve-wracking for the Year Nines but less-so for me.

Before this day I was democratically elected as leader for every one of these sessions –a voting I was not made aware of until the training manual had been thrust into my grasp and my team members had dispersed. Wonderful. Still, I came prepared. An opening ritual was cello-taped to the whiteboard behind my standing figure whilst the new Oranges ogled at it expecting the worse. They were half-right.

"Welcome to your first Peer Support Session Year Nines," I began and they watched me as if I was about to hand them their death sentence. "I've created the unofficial Orange House Chant!" Yep, they weren't going to like me immediately but still I ventured on and chanted out the words with an overly delighted face, which surprisingly some bought then giggled at my forwardness and so weren't humiliated to shout it along with me. Plus a Mexican wave at the end was executed enthusiastically. That was Day One.





PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education is a compulsory subject at Mt Roskill Grammar from year 9 – 12 where all students have two periods per week. All students are expected to wear correct PE uniform for all lessons. Please ensure your son/daughter has their uniform clearly named in full. They may wear a combination of the new or old PE uniform but not uniforms reserved for sport teams.

WE all know the benefits of exercise and eating properly, we have read it, most of us have acted on it, yet we still get many parents signing letters to get their child excused from PE. Please think about what you are doing before signing – there are many things in life we do not feel like doing but most often, once we have done them we are glad we did.

If your child is well enough to be at school then they can still take part in some of the PE lesson. The Physical Education curriculum area is often referred to as having the most valuable skills you can learn for life – teamwork, sportsmanship, peer friendships, cooperation, leadership, self esteem, self confidence, personal identity and self worth. Even though students may be fully involved in sport outside of school they can still benefit in these areas during PE.

Interpersonal skills: (Respect for diversity and cultures, care and concern for others, social justice, communication skills, tolerance):- These are many interpersonal skills and qualities we want to instil in our students as well as the idea of being physically active.

Most of these benefits are not measurable but clearly lead to a more productive and healthy life style.

We hope as parents you can help us to help you instil these skills in your child while they attend Mt Roskill Grammar. So please next time your son/daughter asks for a note to be excused from Physical Education, think twice before giving it. Physical Education is no different to any other subject – you wouldn't think of asking your child to be excused from Maths or English, why PE?

Are your child's medical records with the school up to date, has their PE teacher been informed of any medical issues that might need to be recognised in a PE class? When you enrolled you gave us good information about your child's health. Please keep it up to date.

NZQA FEES COLLECTION 2011

All senior students and 1001 students must pay their NZQA Fees (compulsory) to the accounts office between Wednesday 11th May and Friday 13th May. These fees must be paid so that any credits a student achieves through either Unit or Achievement Standard assessments will be recorded on a student's record of learning. If not paid, the credits will not be released to the student.

The Fee for the majority of students will be \$76.70.
