



Television Title Sequence and the People's Choice Award for "Sirens."


Bo Zhong - Best Year 13 Documentary for "Colourful Soul."

YEAR 13 CAMP 2017

WIDER EDUCATION UPDATE

Over 70% of students have now signed up for the compulsory Wider Education activities from December 5th-7th. All Year 9 students take part in three day trips that rotate each day. These are an Amazing Race, Day Tramp and Sports Day and Swim. Year 10 students have the option of a camp at Marsden Bay (30 minutes south of Whangarei) or Day Trips. The camp is almost full, meaning those who miss out will have to participate in the Day Trips.
