Measles Alert Continues

While the number of measles cases is declining, the virus is still circulating in Auckland school communities. MMR vaccines have been prioritised for anyone under the age of 30 and teachers under the age of 50 years.

Free Meningococcal Disease Vaccine

Critical need to know and action: from 1 December 2019, the vaccine to protect against four groups of meningococcal disease (groups A, C, W and Y) will be free of charge for anyone who will be living in a boarding school hostel or tertiary education hall of residence in 2020.

The Ministry of Health is asking boarding schools to recommend that parents of boarders get their children vaccinated before the new school year. For more information, please refer to the Immunisation Advisory Centre (IMAC) website.

The following is a message from Director of Public Health, Dr Caroline McElnay:

From December 2020, the vaccine will only be funded for students entering their first year of living in a boarding school or hall of residence.

- The government has announced that anyone aged 13 to 25 years who lives in boarding school hostels, tertiary education halls of residence or military barracks is eligible to receive the meningococcal ACWY vaccine free of charge, from 1 December 2019 and for the next 12 months
- Boarders and school leavers moving into halls of residence next year can access this vaccine at their local GP free of charge
- The vaccine will be funded for one year, after which only those entering into their first year of living in these institutions can be vaccinated for meningococcal ACWY free of charge.

It is important to note that the ACWY vaccine does not provide protection against meningococcal B disease. As a result, it is important to consider meningococcal disease even in people who have been vaccinated if they present with symptoms consistent with meningococcal disease.

The meningococcal B vaccine — Bexsero — can be purchased privately.

Form Classes 2020

Following on from the information in our previous newsletter regarding Form Time, next year students will be in Form classes which are horizontally aligned, therefore the whole form class will be students from the same year level. Many students will therefore be with a new form class, in a new location.

Students can find out their form class, form teacher and timetable prior to the first days of school for 2020 using the student portal, Kamar app and emails to parents and students. Information will be loaded onto these places in mid-January.

For students who will be Year 9 and 13, plus any and students who are new to MRGS, they will also find out their form class, form teacher and timetable on their first day back of Term 1 2020, Thursday 30th January. School will start at 9am. Year 9s will need to assemble outside the Hall, where we will start our day with a Powhiri. From there, students will be moved into their Form Class and supported through their first day of high school. Year 13s should look at the lists which will be displayed around the school, with the first list being on A Block wall by the Deans' Centre entrance.

For Year 10, 11, 12 the first day back is Friday 31st January. The school day will start with tutor time, and then continue in the 2020 structure (shown below). They will find the student lists which will be in the main areas of the school, with the first location being on the A block wall closest to the Dean's Centre entrance. On the lists they need to find their name and the form class room they are in. They will then go to their Form Class where they will be given their timetable. Following this, the school day will proceed as normal.

Celebrating the Arts




