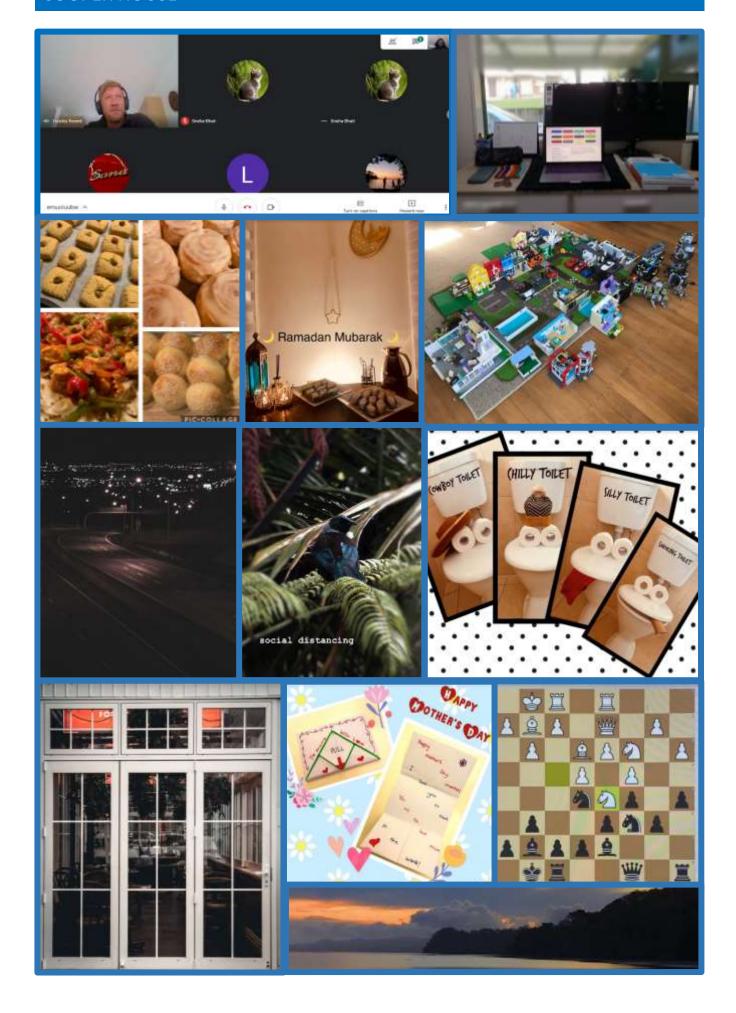

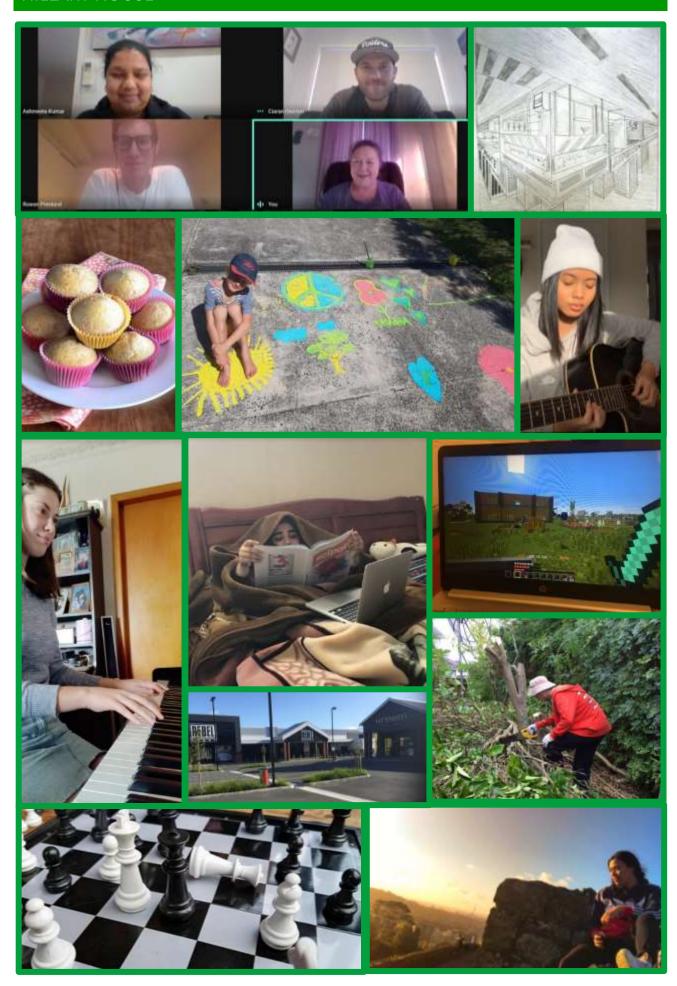
House Messages

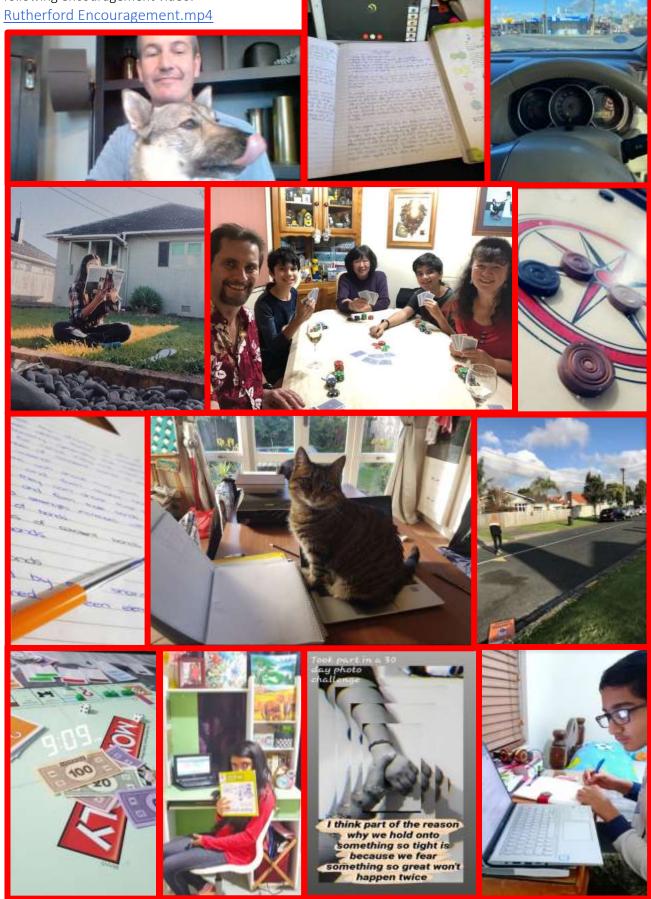
