Neil Campbell was sworn in as a Justice of the High Court at Auckland, 29 July 2020.

Neil is a true Roskill boy, attending Three Kings Primary and Mt Roskill Intermediate, then MRGS from 1980-1985.

Neil is an internationally renowned legal academic and practitioner, primarily in the field of insurance law and commercial litigation. He was made a Queen's Counsel in 2013.

Neil was sworn in by the current Chief Justice, Dame Helen Winkelmann (Lynfield College alumna) – a big day for Mt Roskill in the legal community.



Nominating MRGS with ASB Home Loans
