From the Principal

We'll walk this road together, through the storm. Whatever weather, cold or warm. Eminem.

It is heart-warming to see our community adapting to twists and turns, from everyday challenges to events with more lasting impact. The road travelled this year wasn't on the map. Each challenge affects people differently, bringing a unique flood of thoughts, strong emotions and uncertainty.

Our students are continuing to move toward their goals, even in the smallest ways. We are encouraging students to 'chunk their future', or their day, asking themselves, "What's one thing I know I can accomplish today that helps me move in the direction I want to go?" Doing something regularly - even if it seems like a small accomplishment - helps build learning momentum. Most students worked their way back into usual routines during last week. We finished the week with just 10% less senior students attending than in the week before the recent Level 3 lockdown.

Mask Up Fund

In addition to our routine hygiene practice we are encouraging students to add the capability to wear a mask to their 'Covid toolkit'. Mask wearing provides everyone with a greater confidence to attend school. This week, students wearing masks on entry to school increased from about 40% to 60%. School reusable cloth masks will be available for purchase from the last week of term (September 21).

We have already received a wonderful sponsorship offer to help keep the cost of masks low. Our sponsor will support dollar for dollar any contributions to the 'MRGS Mask Up' fund up to \$1000. A total of \$10,000 would provide a mask for every student free of charge.

Contributions to the fund can be transferred to bank number 12-3033-0358045-02 labelled "mask up".

Practice Externals

Next week seniors will be focusing on practice external examinations. This year the practice externals have increased importance because the grades gained in these exams can be used as evidence should the NCEA externals be disrupted by Covid in Term 4.

We have broken assessments down into one standard 'chunks' held in class time to make the exams as manageable as possible and to enable students to remain in class, learning when they are not being assessed. There are two study days, Friday September 11 for seniors and Friday September 18 for all students.

The NZ Curriculum picks out resilience as a desirable capability for lifelong learners. Educators define resilience as the process of adapting well in the face of adversity, or significant sources of stress. This year is proving to be a masterclass, offering the opportunity for profound personal

growth. Thank you to all the families who are working to help students with the routine day by day challenges – it is in working through these that our leaders of the future are made.


Sports

2020 Education Perfect Science Championship

We had another successful Education Perfect Science Championship during lock down, last week. Our students participated and were engaged for around **1,085** hours online answering **148,495** questions and gained **24 Awards**, 6 more than last year's championship. Our school was placed 1st in New Zealand out of 102 schools and overall in 3rd place.

Senior Practice External Assessments

At the end of this week there is a senior study day to enable seniors to focus on revision for their practice externals. This year the practice externals are held during class time in weeks 9 and 10 of this term.

In weeks 9 and 10 we remain on timetable and all students will be attending class as usual. In some classes practice externals will be held.

The schedule has been posted on the school website, emailed to students and families, and put on Facebook. Printed copies will be posted in the Deans' Centre and central thoroughfares of the school.

Remember:

- as always (but especially during the assessment weeks), being on time to class is critical
- exam conditions are required phones and watches turned off and in bags at the front of the room
- there will be no form time during weeks 9 and 10.

Please encourage your students to continue to study for these practice external assessments. This year more than ever it is important to participate fully in these assessments, as we may be in a position of having to award derived grades for NCEA and those decisions will be made based on student performance in practice assessments.

At the end of week 9 (right in the middle of the assessment weeks), there will be a teacher only day to give students a chance to keep up with their revision.

Lonnie Hutchinson





Lonnie Hutchinson is a renowned multi-media artist who attended MRGS in the late 1970s.

She has exhibited throughout Australasia and internationally. Her works are held in permanent collections of art galleries through Australasia and she has lectured in Art at Canterbury University. She draws on both her Ngāi Tahu and Samoan ancestry and is also influenced by popular culture. In addition to her signature paper cut-outs and digital works, her designs can also be seen in large scale installations.

In 2015, Lonnie was awarded the Creative New Zealand Pasifika Contemporary Artist Award and has also been awarded a number of international residencies.
