Science Fair Prizes

This year Mount Roskill Grammar School had one of its best years ever in the Auckland Science Fair. MRGS entered eight projects in total, five of these went on to become prize winners. The students all put a huge amount of effort into their projects and produced some truly outstanding projects.

Prithi Sharma and Raina Singh came in first place in the planet earth and beyond category with their project 'Exstream Stream' which looked at the health of the waterways around our school and discussed how to restore them.

Amie Mao and Zoe Chen came in second place in the living world category for their project 'Block your... achoo!' which looked at what materials would make the best mask for blocking the spread of disease. Tessa Bolland came third in the physical world category for her project 'Accurate Archery' which looked at which material made the best arrow shaft.

Jashraj Khatri gained a highly commended in the physical world category for his project 'Rainbow in a Leaf' which looked at absorption of light in different leaves and how this could be used to more efficiently grow plants. Jessica Huang and Sumayyah Parker gained a highly commended in the human behaviour category with their project 'Coloured Memories' which looked at colour people are able to remember best.

TRAFFIC NOTICE

Huia No.1 watermain

We are currently replacing the Huia No.1 watermain on Winstone Road, Mt Roskill. The project is required to maintain essential water services to the area. From Monday 5 October we will insert the pipeline across the intersection of Denbigh Avenue and Winstone Road.

Road closure:

To safely insert the pipeline, we will need to close the Denbigh and Winstone intersection from Monday 5 October for approximately three weeks. Detours shown on map below.



How does it affect you?

- The intersection at Denbigh Avenue and Winstone Road will be closed from Monday 5 October for up to three weeks.
- Detours will be in place during the road closure which will be to use Somerset Road, Winstone Road and Memorial Avenue or Mt Albert Road.



Please follow all detours and site signage. Keep safe around the construction site.
