#### From the Principal

Our Mathematics team of Coco Chen, Grace Xu, Riley Mara, and Sylvia McDougall is one of two teams selected to represent New Zealand in the International Mathematical Modelling Challenge. The team spent five consecutive days in the school holidays analysing and solving a real world problem. Real problems require a mix of different kinds of mathematics for their analysis and solution and take time and teamwork. Congratulations to the team on this fantastic achievement, and to their companion team of Ansh Trivedi, Chris Lobo, Joe Wang, and Mohammad Tousif Kabir who were highly commended. Thank you to Mr Dewerse for his organisation of our participation.

Last week we held the first teacher only/accord day of the year. The focus was on numeracy and literacy, and Mana Ōrite mō te Mātauranga Māori – ensuring te Ao Māori is fully represented in the curriculum. The day was very valuable in enabling thinking and planning for changes in NCEA for which full implementation begins in 2023. There are two more accord days scheduled by the Ministry of Education this year: in August to focus on the new Level 1 Achievement Standards, and in November to focus on local curriculum design.

With any change a significant amount of work goes on behind the scenes and I would like to thank our staff for their openness to learning on Thursday last week regarding the forthcoming changes in 2023 to NCEA. Our whānau appreciate you supporting our tauira through this future change. These changes will be trialled in 2022 and implemented in 2023 at NCEA Level 1 (the year 11s in 2023 are our current year 9 tauira). The NCEA Change Programme is a work programme led by the Ministry of Education to deliver the package of seven changes aimed at strengthening NCEA. The first change discussed in the previous session was how NCEA would be made more accessible. The focus on Thursday was on changes two and three; "Equal status for mātauranga Māori in NCEA" and to "Strengthen literacy and numeracy requirements and assessments". I am confident that the transition into these changes are being well led by our senior leaders, heads of department and within school leaders.








#### 2021 International Mathematical Modelling Challenge at MRGS

A mathematical model developed by a team of four MRGS students has been selected as one of two that will represent Aotearoa, New Zealand in the 2021 International Mathematical Modelling Challenge. The team, consisting of Coco Chen, Grace Xu, Riley Mara and Sylvia McDougall, was one of two MRGS teams that took part in the NZ round of this challenge. The other team consisted of Ansh Trivedi, Chris Lobo, Joe Wang and Mohammad Tousif Kabir.



After weekly training during Term 1, our teams had five days during the school holidays to analyse a problem posed by the International Mathematical Modelling Committee. Working from 9am to 5pm in the class each day, and also at home in the evening, they used a variety of skills including coding, spreadsheeting, report writing, research, data processing and analysis and of course lots of mathematics to develop models for a staged problem.



While the topic of the problem cannot yet be publicised (as some countries have yet to start their 5-day period), it was very relevant to our everyday lives, and made the teams wonder how on earth to go about modelling it! After brainstorming some key questions and working out an approach to take, both teams got under way and made good progress on the first stage of the problem.

Some difficulties such as accessing and processing large amounts of data led to frustration at times, but with a bit of prompting from Mr Dewerse (the MRGS advisor) the teams started to work together well, breaking the problem down into smaller tasks that each person took responsibility for. On the final day of the Challenge the teams worked solidly through the day with only a 10-minute break for lunch, while being well supplied with a steady stream of hot waffles made by Mr Dewerse to help keep them going.



The successful MRGS solution and one by a team from Botany Downs Secondary College will now be judged by an international panel of experts, and recognised as Successful Participant, Honourable Mention, Meritorious, or Outstanding. Advisors and teams will be notified of the results in June or July.

#### Japanese Restaurant trip

The students had an amazing opportunity to try authentic Japanese foods and bond with other students who they may have not met before as they are in different year levels. ## Debating


This week Roskill hosted a senior open debating round where 26 teams from around Central Auckland debated the moot 'This house would legalize performing-enhancing drugs in sport'.

## Teen Brain

Mt Roskill Grammar School is proud to announce that the host of the documentary "All in the Mind", and co-host of the TV Series "The Secret life of Girls", Nathan Wallis, Aotearoa's renowned neuroscience educator, is coming to our community with his talk - Teen Brain.

Covid has put all of us in an unpredictable environment and this has added layers of complexity to an already complex time of life - especially f or children and teens already dealing with issues around anxiety and depression. During adolescence parts of the teenage brain are "shut for renovations". This is the part of the brain responsible for regulating the teenager's moods, for understanding consequences, maintaining focus and for thinking about the well-being of others. And the 'teen' years can start as early as 9 and end anywhere from 18 to 32 years of age!

However the good news is that there are clear tips and practices from the research that can help and enhance our teen's ability (and yours) to cope with this tricky time and minimise the stress for everyone. Understanding the changes that are taking place will help you to navigate successfully these important and formative years. Nathan will share strategies with participants to achieve better relationships and better outcomes for the children and teens we work and/or live with!


