Uniform

Reminder of our school expectations ensuring that all students are wearing our school uniform correctly.

- Only regulation MRGS jackets may be worn
- MRGS caps and bucket hats are allowed
- Hoodies are not allowed
- Only full foot, plain black school shoes are allowed. If you are unsure about what shoes are allowed please contact the Deans.

Other Aspects of Uniform

- Hats (optional): MRGS regulation cap or MRGS regulation bucket hat. These may only be worn outside. Caps must be worn peak to the front.
- Hair: Hair must be kept tidy at all times. Hair bands and hair ties must be plain black or navy. Hair styles must be reasonably conventional. Unnatural colours, streaks, highlights or patches of unnatural colour are not permitted.
- Facial Shaving: Faces are to be clean-shaven.
- Scarves (optional): Regulation MRGS scarf or plain black or plain navy blue scarf.
- **Head Scarves**: Black.
- Make-up: Students are not permitted to wear make-up or nail-polish.
- Jewellery (optional): Metal ear stud or thin, plain metal sleeper worn in the lobe of each ear. No nose stud or piercings on any other part of the face are allowed.

Kimono and robot experience

When I entered my Japanese classroom, I noticed that something was different. Three staff from the Consulate General of Japan had come to our school to teach us more about Japanese culture. But to my surprise, we got to learn way more things about the beautiful county.

Free catch up Immunisations August 2nd – 8th

WHAT?

Shortly there will be a FREE service in our school where nurses will offer immunisations if students require them. Many young people missed out as children on immunisations to protect them from measles, mumps and rubella (MMR vaccine). Some young people may also have missed out on other immunisations to protect them from whooping cough (Boostrix vaccine) and some types of cancers (HPV vaccine).


WHY?

Being immunised protects ourselves and also protects our whanua/aiga who are too young (babies) or unwell (people having cancer treatment) to be immunised. Looking to the future, some workplaces and university accommodation are keen to know what their staff/ students have been immunised against.

HOW?

School nurses, supported by District Health Board staff have checked to see which vaccines students may have missed. Information is available in consent forms that will be sent out in the coming weeks to students who may have missed out on these vaccines. Parents/guardians need to sign these consent forms and return them to school so you can receive the immunisations. These forms should be filled in and returned even if you do not wish for your child to receive these at school (each form has a section for declining at school immunisation). You can get these vaccines any time at your GP clinic for FREE also. Nurses will come to school August 2nd-8th to provide these vaccines to students at school.
