About 80% of students have taken up the opportunity demonstrating care and respect in wearing masks and maintaining acceptable physical distance. Our two hour lessons have contributed to a settled environment with minimal transitions, and an opportunity for extended in depth learning.

Well done to Year 9 and 10 students who are continuing with their online learning and making the most of 'live lessons'.

The vaccination event at the school was a great success with 281 people, including many students vaccinated. Over one third of these were first doses. Thank you to community leaders, and school staff for the excellent work in encouraging people to get vaccinated and organising the event. Every vaccination contributes to the great vaccine wall of Mount Roskill keeping everyone safe.

### Juniors

Learning tasks will be posted at the beginning of each week in our blended learning framework template for each subject. Teachers will provide one online class.

#### Seniors

Learning tasks will be posted at the beginning of each week in our blended learning framework template for each subject. Teaching will be face to face at school.

- Senior classes will be taught onsite in 2 two hour blocks.
- Seniors will see their teacher 1-2 times per week.

Senior practice exams have started and will run until November 5.

<u>Schedule of dates and times of practice exams</u> This schedule has been emailed to all affected families and students.

We are aware that some students will have finished some subjects for the year by achieving the required amount of credits. Those students may make the decision to focus their energy on the outstanding work in their other subjects. However, if a student is on site and wishes to leave after the first lesson because they have finished with a subject, parents/caregivers must notify the school that they have permission to leave. We have a duty of care to not release students during the school day unless prior arrangement has been made with parents. Students without permission to leave will need to attend both daily lessons.

Accelerated year 10 students are allowed to attend for only their Maths and Science lessons and will be released after those lessons are complete for the day.

### **Engagement Scores**

With Year 11 - 13 students now able to be back onsite, engagement scores will only be completed for Year 9 and 10 students. Please remember that these are an indication of the level of engagement of your child in their online learning, to support you to have positive conversations with your student about their learning and progress. 
### Attendance
