Junior Exams

While we do not have information on a possible return date for year 9 and 10 students, we would like to confirm some aspects of teaching and learning for juniors for the remainder of 2021.

Online learning will continue while students are prevented from returning to school. If we are given the opportunity to welcome junior students back to school, we will provide face to face learning here at school. Whether the students return or not, we have decided to cancel formal end of year exams for juniors. All families will still receive a report on their student's achievement, engagement and participation in the wider life of the school. Subjects may conduct some assessment in the form of tests or assignments to ascertain curriculum level achievement, but we will not hold formal exams for juniors this year.
