Sport photographs

On Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th of August we have team photos for our sports teams and extra-curricular groups. The schedule for these has been emailed to parents and students of all teams and groups having photos, and is accessible for students from their Kaiako.

For our photos to be consistent and of good quality we will need all our students to be dressed correctly in their sports uniform for the period of their photo, as well as boys being clean shaven (unless they have a beard-pass) and all students wearing only jewellery that is in line with our uniform policy. Phone use

Phone use in lessons is causing distraction to students ability to focus and engage in learning. Because students learning is important to us, this week we implemented additional layers to our phone expectations.

Our expectation of phones in lessons is:

Phones need to be on silent, in students' bags during lessons, unless directed by the teacher to be used for learning

Teachers will continue to communicate the schools expectations of phones. If phones are seen during lessons, students will be reminded of the expectations and asked to put phones in their bags. If a student is seen with their phone again, students will be asked to hand the phone to the teacher. At the end of the lesson, students will have a brief conversation with the teacher and their phone will be returned to them.

Teachers will record the phone use and confiscation of the phone via kamar. For students who have multiple reports from teachers of phone use, they will first have a conversation with their Dean. The second and subsequent times teachers report a student's phone use in lessons, parents will be contacted and will be asked to meet with the Deputy Principal of their child's House. In conversation with whānau, students' privilege to have their phone in school will be removed for a certain period of time.

If students lose the privilege of having their phone in school, they will be expected to hand the phone in to admin at the start of the day. They can come back at the end of the school day to get their phone back.

In order to support us with phone use in lessons, we ask for parents to only communicate with their child during break times. If there is an urgent matter, please contact admin and we will communicate with your child as soon as possible. This also enables us to support students with upsetting situations in the best possible way.

Teaching and learning time is precious. We need to maximise every minute of learning to ensure all students achieve their highest potential. Teachers need to be supported and empowered to teach and support learning. Our students have done a great job so far with improving the phone use in lessons, which we are very grateful for.
















Winter Sports - Seasons coming to an end




Meleana is currently studying for her masters in Social Work. She spoke about the influence of her teachers throughout the campus.

Learning Hub Review



Ground Zero by Alan Gratz

This book follows two timelines. In 2001, 9 year old Brandon gets suspended from school and has to go to work with his Dad, who works at 'Windows on the World' - the famous restaurant on the 107th floor of the North Tower of the World Trade Centre in Manhattan. Unfortunately for Brandon, the date is 11th of September.

18 years later, on the 11th of September 2019, 11 year old Rashmina is living in her village in the mountains of Afghanistan and has known nothing but war, a war built on revenge and retribution for an event she knows nothing about.

Gratz hasn't pulled any punches and the research he has done is breath-taking. It will connect our children to the events of that day that they will have only ever seen as photos or news footage. And an incredibly important book for adults too, especially those of us that remember sitting in front of our television screens all around the world, dumb founded and horror-stuck as we watched in real time as the planes hit, the people jumped and the towers fell.

It goes without saying there are some very triggering scenes in this book. Gratz has clearly done his homework on everything that was going on inside those towers that morning and scenes described are graphic and confronting. Elevators dropping, people catching on fire, bodies falling from the top floors in front of them and being in the mall under the Towers when they collapsed. It is confronting but, as with all good books, this may start uncomfortable but important conversations with trusted adults.

Exams

All students who will be taking part in NCEA this year will have received their National Students Number (NSN) card. Some students find that they forget their card but if they have a picture of it on their phones they will be ok.
