Te Kete Rukuruku a Whakaotirangi Project







"Ka tangi te Pīpīwharauroa, ko ngā karere a Mahuru"

The arrival of the pīpīwharauroa signals the beginning of planting of kumara.

On Monday 13 November, our kura launched a Mātauranga and Science project focussing on kumara. The project "Te Kete Rukuruku a Whakaotirangi' is looking at the science and mātauranga around growing of kumara and soil types used. Our rangatahi worked with tamariki from Mount Roskill Primary, Mount Roskill Intermediate and Professor Nick Roskruge from Tāhuri Whenua and Massey University. From this, mātauranga opportunities will occur working with Marae and connecting potentially to māra in Waikato, Parihaka and Te Tai Tokerau in 2024. There are also opportunities for Level 1 and 2 students to gain credits from their learning and work from Science or Education for Sustainability. Aktive Student Coach of the Year Winner - Tom Watkinson



Text Book Returns



Text books and English texts can be returned to the school by dropping them at the Admin block or returning them directly to the B6 resource room.

Please have a hunt around for any texts you might still have. There are currently almost 700 books that have been lent to students.

Phone Use

Our expectations of phones in lessons are:

Phones need to be on silent, in students' bags during lessons, unless directed by the teacher to be used for learning

Teachers will continue to communicate the schools expectations of phones. If phones are seen during lessons, students will be reminded of the expectations and asked to put phones in their bags. If a student is seen with their phone again, students will be asked to hand the phone to the teacher. At the end of the lesson, students will have a brief conversation with the teacher and their phone will be returned to them.

Teachers will record the phone use and confiscation of the phone via kamar. For students who have multiple reports from teachers of phone use, they will first have a conversation with their Dean. The second and subsequent times teachers report a student's phone use in lessons, whānau will be contacted and will be asked to meet with the Deputy Principal of their child's House. In conversation with whānau, students' privilege to have their phone in school will be removed for a certain period of time.

In order to support us with phone use in lessons, and maximise teaching and learning time, we ask for parents to only communicate with their child during break times. If there is an urgent matter, please contact admin and we will communicate with your child as soon as possible. This also enables us to support students with upsetting situations in the best possible way.


Katalina Ma is an alumna student and staff member, and was most recently our guest speaker at Pasifika Graduation.









































Sports
