February 2024 Swimming Success



Alumni News

Over the summer holidays, some of our swimmers have been making a real splash.

Ethan Stocks travelled to Australia as part of a Swimming NZ Open Water Team to compete in the New South Wales Open Water Championships and finished 5th in his age group in the 7.5km event and 6th in the 5km event.

He followed these impressive results up in Taupo in the New Zealand Open Water Championships by coming 2nd in both the 15-17 year age group and overall in the 7.5km event and 1st in 15-17 year age group in the 2.5km event and 2nd overall. **Daniel Kregting** also swam in the New Zealand Open Water Championships and placed 5th in the 7.5km 15-17 age group.

Nemanya Markovic also travelled to Australia as part of a Swimming New Zealand Age Group Team to compete in the Queensland State Championships and received two bronze medals, one for 200m breaststroke and one for 200m Individual Medley.

He also had two other top ten placings of 8th in 100m breaststroke and 400m Individual Medley. He completed the trip with three further top twenty placings.

Ala Vailala (pictured third from the left above) is an ex-student of MRGS. Last year, she was part of the 2023 Te Rito Journalism Project cohort.

This project is in partnership with NZME, Whakaata Māori, Newshub and Pacific Media Network to ensure newsrooms reflect a multicultural Aotearoa.

She currently works as a journalist at the NZ Herald and also provides content to Newshub and other publications.

As an exceptional leader when she was at MRGS, and her subsequent work as Youth MP and supporting young people in Tonga to learn the violin, it is wonderful that Ala continues to tell stories that matter.

Student Devices

MRGS is an established BYOD school, meaning that our students need to have a device to support their learning in the classroom. MRGS' teachers use the Google Classroom platform with all their classes as a way of distributing information, assigning classwork and homework tasks, and giving feedback on assessments.

Through our ICT partner New Era, we give our community access to a purchasing portal called Acquire.

New Era seeks to provide our community with the most competitive pricing for any new device purchases, but if you are struggling to provide a device for learning and you have a community services card, we do have a limited number of Chromebooks available for loan for the 2024 academic year.

Students have until **Friday the 1st of March** to apply for these by presenting their parent or guardian's community services card and filling out a letter that outlines their responsibilities as a borrower.
