The first of our mentoring sessions takes place this Thursday 14th March where all Year 11, 12 and 13 students and families will meet with their mentors to discuss progress so far this year.

Conversations between our students, their whānau and our teachers are an important part of supporting our students and building a partnership with home and we hope that you can join us on the day.

These meetings are an important time to ask questions about NCEA or how your child is progressing. Please discuss these at our mentoring meetings.

## **Mentoring Session 1**

## Phone use

Our policy on phone use in Term 1 is that during lessons students' phones should not be visible and should be on silent. Students can be enabled to use their phones during lessons at the teacher's discretion.

From Term 2, there is a country wide requirement for phones to be "Away for the Day". This means that once students are at school, their phones need to be in their bags, on silent for the duration of the school day. This includes break times.

We are utilising Term 1 to talk with students and staff about this and what this will look like at school, as well as keeping parents updated.

In 2023 our teachers and students did a lot of work to have phones away. This saw an increase in student engagement and focus during learning. We are hopeful with the addition of phones away during break times we will see more interpersonal, face to face connection between students and teachers, students being more involved in activities during lunch time, and less distraction from their phones.

#### Attendance

Our year has started well. We currently have an average percentage of **86.5%**.

## **Missed NCEA Assesments**



## National Library grant replaces books lost in flood

Last January, the school's library collection was badly damaged in the Auckland floods. We lost around 6,000 books, which was roughly 60% of a collection that had been lovingly built up over decades. It was a big blow for us as we opened our new library space without the one thing libraries are supposed to have ... lots of BOOKS!!!!

We were overjoyed when the National Library advised us we had been chosen to receive a grant from the government's School Library Collection Recovery Programme, set up straight after the flooding, which enables us to replace a large part of our lost collection in one go.

With input, requests and recommendations from teachers in the departments, experts at the National Library and - most importantly - our students, we worked hard to put together an incredible, modern, diverse and exciting collection.

Over the course of this term we are expecting to receive almost 5,000 brand new books and graphic novels.


## Sporting Successes (cont.)
