
Online Learning

This term our students may need to work from home for various reasons so that our students can receive the best education possible under the circumstances. There are three threads to our online learning approach at MRGS: Google Classroom and the Blended Learning Framework.

Google Classroom


Google Classroom is where our online learning takes place. All our teachers have made classrooms available for all our students in all classes. On their Google Classroom page, they will find the class work that is being taught in-class on a daily basis. If you would like access to a Google Classroom to see what your student should be doing, then please email the teacher directly and they can give you access.



Blended Learning Framework

Every Google Classroom has a copy of that class's Blended Learning Framework. This is a document that reminds students about prior learning, instructs students on current learning, provides opportunities to practice their work, and encourages them to review their learning to embed it as new knowledge.

Students should refer to the Blended Learning Framework to make sure they understand what they are meant to be learning and how it relates to their prior learning and next steps. It is not meant as an exhaustive step-by-step lesson plan, but rather as an indicator of what is being learned.

COVID-19 related absences

If you need to pick up your child urgently for COVID-19 related reasons please ring the phone number on the board in the foyer. The DP on duty will arrange to bring your child to the Dean's gate for you to collect them.

Please make sure your child brings a mask to school every day and talk through the proper way to wear a mask. A mask should cover their nose, mouth and chin without gaps above, below or on the sides.

Masks are a proven way to stop the transmission of COVID-19 and our government has made it a requirement that everyone must wear one while indoors at school.

Mentoring

One of the ways that we aim to achieve our School-wide goals of raising achievement through targeted actions and creating powerful partnerships for learning is through our mentoring programme. Every one of our senior students is mentored by a staff member who works with them over three years.

We find that the most powerful partnerships for learning involve whānau, and usually we would hold a Term 1 mentoring conference that involves mentors, mentees, and their families. Due to the public health restrictions, we have set up a system that will still ensure goals are set and families are communicated with, but that keeps all of us safe.

On **Wednesday March 9th** we will be holding a series of mentoring conferences. The school day will only be three periods long with a 12.35pm finish for junior students. Our seniors will then be invited to join a fifteenminute conference with their mentor either face-to-face at school, or online via google meets. During this meeting they will set an academic goal for the year which will be shared with home via a Google Doc. Whānau who are able to join the meeting alongside their child are encouraged to do so as this will help with goal setting.

More detail on how these conferences are booked will be made available next week.

Guidance Counselling Department

A warm welcome to those of you who are new to our school community from the counselling team!

We are delighted to meet with your Year 9 rangatahi twice this term.

In the first week, we ran a **Whākamarie** workshop for all new students. This workshop is to support our Year 9's in developing healthy ways of managing stress and anxiety. The methods taught are based on the latest neuroscience, and on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy: catching "snake" (negative) thoughts, and changing them into "ladder" (positive) thought.

Later this term, we will run a Manaakitanga workshop.

This workshop explains how the counselling service works, and teaches how students can self-refer or refer a friend thay may be concerned about.

We have five counsellors in our team. All counselling is confidential, unless there is an imminent risk to safety. Teachers do not have access to counselling information.

We also discuss the Roskill culture of respect, and supporting and maintaining the mana of all students and staff. When harassment, exclusion or bullying are identified, we address it, and we restore the harm. The person who has been harmed is given a priority voice in deciding how the matter is dealt with. Emotional safety is a priority at Roskill. Inclusion and connectedness are pre-conditions for wellbeing and learning.

As Counsellors we use an appointment system to make sure we can give uninterrupted quality time to each student we work with. We welcome whānau referrals.
