School Board

As we head into the end of term break I would like to thank the tauira and staff for their resilience this term. I wish them well as they prepare for the next steps in NCEA alongside an opportunity to recharge over the break.

With the School Board elections coming up next term I encourage members of our MRGS community to consider if you want to be a Board member or encourage those you believe would represent our community and values well. Board members are active leaders in our schools. They have an important role of supporting strong professional leadership and ensuring effective teaching for all students through informed governance.

If you are thinking about becoming a Board member then please contact the Presiding Member, Marjet Pot or any of the School Board members on the website to find out what is involved in being a Board member. The School Board should have a range of skills and people who are committed to work together as a team. These skills could include but not limited to people skills, financial, engineering, leadership or marketing skills.

We also need Board members who represent their community and want to be part of the team which raises educational outcomes for students. Training is provided on what is required of a Board member to help those people who are new to the role. Parents/caregivers and people in the wider community can be Board members. We want the MRGS Board to represent the diversity of our school community.

At the MRGS Board member elections, five people are elected onto the School Board which leaves the opportunity to co-opt a further four people. This co-option process aims to ensure we have the right skills and cultural diversity around the table to make the decisions required to govern the school. The Principal is a member of the School Board and combined with the staff Board member they bring the educational expertise to the School Board discussions. The student Board member brings a student perspective to the discussions.

People often ask me what the School Board does and so here is a list below of some responsibilities.

- Working with the principal and consult with staff, students and the community
- Setting the educational goals and strategic direction of the school
- Monitoring progress and inform parents on how the school is progressing against its annual targets and on the development of the students
- Deciding how the school's funding will be spent
- Support the development of all staff
- Ensuring the school is a physically and emotionally safe place for all students and staff, and is inclusive of and caters for students with differing needs
- Overseeing the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.

Being a Board member requires time as there are many meetings and public events which require Board member presence. The School Board elections are the opportunity to vote for candidates who will make a positive difference for your children's education.

On Wednesday 31st August at 7.00pm in the Butler Hall there is a meet the candidates evening. This is a public meeting so come along and meet the candidates and hear how they will represent the school community. It is equally as important that you take the time to vote. Your vote counts. It is preferable that you post your election papers early as the post is often quite unreliable, or drop them off at the school yourself.

Nominations and votes must be on site at the office by the deadline, not posted/post-dated. Please take the time to vote and get your voting papers back to school before the deadline.

Key election dates: Nominations close at noon on Wednesday 17 August; Meet the candidates, 7.00pm in the Butler Hall on Wednesday 31 August; Voting closes 4pm on Wednesday 21 September.

Parent Election Notice

Nominations are open for the election of 5 (five) parent representatives to the school board.

All eligible voters will receive a nomination form via email at the start of term 3. Use this form to nominate yourself or someone in your community. You will also receive a nomination cover letter calling for nominations. Information on who is not eligible to be a board member is provided on the back of the nomination form.

Nomination forms can also be obtained from the school office.

Nominations close at **noon** on **Wednesday 17 August 2022**. You may provide a signed candidate statement and photograph with your nomination.

The electoral roll is held at the school and can be viewed during normal school hours.

An evening for prospective candidates to speak to voters will be on **Wednesday 31 August** at **7.00pm** in the Butler Hall.

As nominations are received, there will be a list of candidates' names kept at the school up until Election Day, which you can view.

Voting forms and candidate information will be posted on or by Wednesday 24 August 2022.

Voting closes at 4pm on Wednesday 21 September 2022.

YouDance



Japanese Trivia Night

The Japanese Trivia Tournament is an annual competition among junior students, where teams of four compete against other schools and their teams, across five rounds, to test their knowledge of Japan. Over 100 school teams nationwide at eight different venues across New Zealand competed at the same time to answer a variety of Japanese questions. Both MRGS teams practised and studied prior to the Championship. All the team members and Kojima Sensei took this opportunity to dress up in yukatas (summer kimono) to take pride in our study of Japan and its culture.

MRGS came 5th place overall in Auckland - Team 1 with 34 points placing 7th and Team 2 with 35 points placing 5th, although they only had 1 point apart. This experience was a lot of fun and the students all had a wonderful time. We are very grateful for our wonderful Japanese teacher Ms Kojima, as this event would have never been possible without her as she was the national organiser of the event.

Matariki Planting


On Tuesday we had a group of our junior tauira supporting the planting of native trees along our Te Auaunga (Oakley Creek) that runs alongside the school. Pā Harakeke

ISOLATION INFORMATION

- A reminder to keep your children at home if they show any signs of being unwell for the safety of the whole school community.
- Please notify the school immediately at https://attendance.mrgs.school.nz/ if your child has a positive COVID-19 test result or is notified as a household contact and has been advised to self-isolate.
- It is really important that your child does not return to school before their isolation period has finished. Positive cases should isolate for **7 days**. Household contacts should isolate for **7** days from the date of the first person testing positive or showing symptoms. You do not have to isolate if you have already had COVID-19 in the last 90 days.

School Uniform

Our school expectations are that students will wear the school uniform correctly to and from school. We ask that whānau support this. Uniform checks will continue at the gate and parents will be contacted if there are concerns.

A particular focus will be on

- Correct footwear sandals are not permitted
- Regulation jumpers and jackets no hoodies
- MRGS hats only
- Facial hair clean shaven
- Hair styles must be reasonably conventional. Unnatural colours, streaks, highlights or patches of unnatural colour are not permitted.

Incorrect uniform items worn in school will be **confiscated** and returned to students on Friday after 3.05pm as per the school guidelines.
