# **Student Vehicles**

Students are allowed to drive a vehicle to school where they have parent/caregiver permission and hold the required NZ Drivers Licence. It is important that student drivers follow our guidelines to keep themselves and our campus community safe.

Please contact us if you need your username and password for the Kamar portal.

A reminder to keep your children at home if they show any signs of being unwell for the safety of the whole school community. It is really important that your child does not return to school before their isolation period has finished. Positive cases should isolate for **7 days**. Household contacts should isolate for **7 days** from the date of the first person testing positive or showing symptoms. Once a student has recovered from COVID-19 they do not need to isolate for 3 months if someone they live with tests positive. BUT they do need to isolate if they test positive again.

In our assemblies last week, we shared this infographic with our students in regards to attendance. We asked them to think about where they sit on the table in terms of their overall attendance percentage, and what that therefore means for the amount of time they are missing lessons and the impact on learning.

Your support is greatly appreciated in encouraging your child to be at school as much as possible to provide them with the best possible opportunity to make progress in their learning, ask questions of their peers and teachers, receive feedback and feed forward, and continuing to seek tūmanakotanga in reaching their academic goals.

# School Uniform

Our school expectations are that students will wear the school uniform correctly to and from school. We ask that whānau support this. Uniform checks will continue at the gate and parents will be contacted if there are concerns.

A particular focus will be on:

- Correct footwear sandals are not permitted
- Regulation jumpers and jackets no hoodies
- MRGS hats only
- Facial hair clean shaven
- Hair styles must be reasonably conventional. Unnatural colours, streaks, highlights or patches of unnatural colour are not permitted.
