Maara kumara Te Kete Rukuruku o Whakaotirangi

On Tuesday we relaunched Te Kete Rukuruku o Whakaotirangi kaupapa which focuses on blending Mātauranga Māori alongside STEM learning. This is our second year and there was lots of excitement to begin another year of planting.

We were lucky to have further support from Prof Nick Roskruge (Professor in Ethnobotany) and Mātua Sai who have been doing extensive mahi in this area and on climate change.

Tauira from all three campus schools met in Te Puawaitanga o te Mātauranga to hear kōrero about the importance of kūmara not only as a source of food but it's important connection to whakapapa and navigation of the Pacific.

We planted four maara (gardens) at MRPS, each with various soils to fair test which variable will have the greatest harvest.

We were also shown by Prof Nick how to build our own tāpapa to grow the kūmara tipu (plants) ensuring we are able to play our part in protecting and sharing old variations of kūmara.





A huge mihi to Mr Syme and Whaea Jackie for their leadership and encouragement of the kaupapa, Ying from Curious Minds who helped our initial kaupapa begin, our tumuaki Mr Webb, Mrs Walsham and Mr O'Reilly for their ongoing support, and kaiako who organised students to take part.
