

Kia ora koutou,

We celebrated Cultural Week in school this week. This is a strong tradition at Mount Roskill Grammar School and celebrates the diversity of our community.

As one of the most diverse schools in New Zealand, we value the culture that each of our students brings to school each day, and this week has been an opportunity to celebrate the diversity of cultures within our school.

We have had performances in assemblies, cultural activities at break times and food stalls from around the world. The week culminated in our cultural dress day today. I want to thank our prefects for taking the lead and organising the week so well.

Appointments



We request that, whenever possible, appointments be scheduled outside of school hours.

If your child has an appointment during school time, please let us know in advance by letting our attendance officer know before 9 am so we can arrange for the student to be ready at the time you require.

Please be mindful that sometimes it can take time to get your child from class, so letting us know in advance ensures you can make the appointment on time.

Punctuality

From the start of Week 3, we are removing the 9.04 am bell. The 8.55 am bell will still ring, signalling to students that they should make their way to Period 1. Students should be ready for their classes for learning to begin at 9 am.

Punctuality is an important life skill. To support students to be on time to school, we will be sending home a text and email to let you know if your child has been late, or absent from Period 1. Please support your child to be on time for learning.

Nurses at MRGS

We are very lucky to have an enhanced based health service, with a fantastic team of nurses to support our students.



Learning remains the priority, and students are encouraged to utilise the nurses during break times, seeking support only during class time if they are extremely unwell.

At the end of the night, we left feeling proud, having scored 4th out of the 20 teams.


Huge thanks to my teammates — Martin, Neel, and Ben — for being such great teammates.
