Health Notice: Measles

Health New Zealand is alerting schools to an escalating risk of measles as it responds to a measles outbreak following confirmation of new cases of measles

Measles is a serious and highly contagious disease. It makes most people very sick and can cause severe complications.

Measles symptoms can include:

- an illness that begins with a high fever (over 38 C), cough, runny nose, and sore red eyes (conjunctivitis)
- a rash, beginning on the face and gradually spreading down the body to the arms and legs, which can last up to one week

If you suspect you may have measles, please phone ahead before visiting your doctor so they can take precautions to prevent measles from spreading. You can call Healthline for free anytime on 0800 611 116 for information and advice.

A few important things to note:

- · We will keep you informed as required.
- If there are no measles cases at our school, students and staff should attend school regardless of vaccination status.
- If your child is diagnosed with measles, please inform Mrs Gaitau immediately at meagan.gaitau@mrgs.school.nz
- If there is a case, we will contact Public Health, who will provide advice. Public Health will check school rolls against the Aotearoa Immunisation Register.

School uniform donations

We have several students and families in need every year, and your generosity enables us to help them.

Please bring them to the front office (once you've finished using them for your exams).

Appointments



We request that, whenever possible, appointments be scheduled outside of school hours.

If your child has an appointment during school time, please let us know in advance by letting our attendance officer know before 9 am so we can arrange for the student to be ready at the time you require.

Please be mindful that sometimes it can take time to get your child from class, so letting us know in advance ensures you can make the appointment on time.

Nurses at MRGS

We are very lucky to have an enhanced based health service, with a fantastic team of nurses to

support our students.



Learning remains the priority, and students are encouraged to utilise the nurses during break times, seeking support only during class time if they are extremely unwell.

Please keep your child home if they are unwell.

Education Perfect Science World Series Championships

There were over 1,413 schools worldwide that competed. Over five days, Mt Roskill Grammar students were engaged in Science learning by answering 86,934 questions, earning 54,447 points, which is a tremendous effort!

Our School's ranking in the championship is as follows:

- 9th overall globally out of 1,413 schools
- 2nd overall in New Zealand out of 309 schools
- 3rd overall in the 1001-2500 students category out of 191 schools
- 2nd in New Zealand for the 1001-2500 students category out of 51 schools

Our Elite Award winners were awarded a Certificate and a Badge and were in the top 1% of all competitors. Kamil Muhammad (Yr 9) with an overall individual score of 7,692, gaining 1st place in school and Kingsley Li (Yr 9) with a score of 7,007 points in 2nd place. Manha Ahmed (Yr 10) and Jiaqi Guo (Yr 9) gained an Emerald Award (3,500+ points).

The students who gained a GOLD Award (2,000+ points) are Elsa Culham (Yr 11), Jiya Patel (Yr 9) and Shreeya Prabhu (Yr 10).

We are proud of all the award winners as they have demonstrated our school value of tūmanakotanga!

Te Auaunga Maramataka – Curious Minds

An exciting new cross-school initiative focused on reconnecting students to their local environment through mātauranga Māori and environmental science is happening on our awa. A collective of schools from the upper catchment – Mt Roskill Grammar, Intermediate & Primary, and Dominion Road have come together to take part in a pilot programme that is being coordinated by <u>COMET</u>, with support from Boffa Miskell and Glasgow Contractors, and Ngā Ringa o Te Auaunga – Friends of Oakley Creek.

The project presents a unique opportunity for students with 'huge potential for cultural and STEM learning'. After initial training in water monitoring – a key part of the project, the students are doing water monitoring and observations at three sites along the awa – the waterfall, Walmsley Park and Molley Green Reserve. The first session, at the waterfall, was a great success, with lots of learning and fun.
